In the first few weeks of the 119th Congress, we have endorsed letters on protecting Title IX and education equity (opposing Linda McMahon's nomination as U.S. Secretary of Education), civil rights (opposing H.R.28 and EO 14166), economic security (supporting the Job Protection Act), and reproductive rights. Consider participating in "Taking Action." They also have a campaign against the SAVE Act.



From AAUW National: Across the nation, laws and policies hinder equal access to quality education. From budget cuts to legislative rollbacks, the road ahead is tough. AAUW advocates and supports the following:

- Economic security and equal pay
- Diversity, equity, and inclusion
- · Reproductive health
- Humanity
- Education & Advocacy: support AAUW's public policy and member advocacy programs, which are now vitally important to defending higher education and rights for women on campus

This administration's executive orders cover issues that range from trade, immigration and U.S. foreign aid to demographic diversity, civil rights, education, health, and the firing of federal workers. Some executive orders have an immediate policy impact while others are more symbolic, and others are already being challenged by federal lawsuits. There is no doubt that Trump is trying to move the country rightward and trying to establish a more authoritative government with the executive Branch taking the most powerful unit.

Highlights of recent Executive Orders and work of DOGE:

- Affecting reproductive rights by trying to exclude Planned Parenthood from receiving funds from Medicare and extending a lawsuit to reimpose restrictions on the abortion pill mifepristone and limit access nationwide by ending telemedicine prescriptions.
- Pushed for cuts to Medicaid funding, potentially impacting millions of beneficiaries and the financial health of hospitals and community health centers
- Purged USAID programs which support foreign aid involving health care, disease prevention and emergency responses. The programs that were cut puts millions of people in allied counties at risk of starvation, disease and death and gives Russia, China, and other adversaries opportunities to gain influence abroad
- Ordered the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau to stop all its work, effectively shutting down an agency that was created to protect consumers after the 2008 financial crisis and subprime mortgage-lending scandal.
- Slashed the EPA's protections regulating areas such as tailpipe pollution, waterway protection and power plant emissions. Withdrew from the Paris Climate agreement, signed by 196 countries to "significantly reduce the risks and impacts of climate change,"
- Withdrew from WHO and accidentally fired officials working on bird flu outbreak Jeopardized
 national security when firing nuclear safety employees, air traffic controllers, the heads of the
 Transportation Security Administration and Coast Guard and eliminated all the members of a key
 aviation security advisory group.
- Eliminated all programs involving DEI and transgender protections.
- Plans to eliminate the Department of Education which distributes dollars to colleges and schools
 and manages the federal student loan portfolio. It is legally required to ensure that students and
 teachers with disabilities are treated fairly and that low-income schools get the resources they need
 to keep pace with more affluent ones. The agency also issues regulations for colleges to hold them
 accountable for preparing graduates for well-paying jobs.
- Holding aid for Ukraine and supported Russia in general assembly vote as concerning Ukraine's territorial integrity.
- DOGE employees are completely unvetted and includes the unelected bureaucrat Musk and agents (such as Edward C. who was fired from his last job for leaking information to a competing company,

or Mark E. who tweeted that he would support "an eugenic immigration policy", "normalize Indian hate", and "no marriage outside an ethnicity".).

An organization called Common Cause tried to run an ad in the Washington Post and the paper refused to run the ad, so they posted this in Times' Square:
